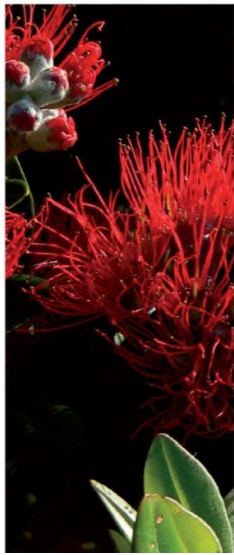

Foreword

This document details some of the communications and initiatives (including meetings, webpages, newspaper articles and more) underway in relation to earthquake recovery and rebuilding in Christchurch and Canterbury in March and April 2011. It also provides a list of some of the individuals involved in these activities.

The document began as a way for Landcare Research to track emerging ideas on how Christchurch could, or should, be rebuilt. Activities that focus on ideas for rebuilding remain prominent in this document but, over time, the boundaries of the exercise expanded. This expansion saw the document include a sample of other communications and activities. In particular, some websites and news releases containing practical information were added when the document was used as background for a student project by the University of St Andrews in Scotland.

This document began as an internal resource, put together rapidly in March and April 2011, and with a focus on collecting large volumes of information relatively quickly. It used an informal snowballing methodology, following links and searches from one initiative to another. It has become apparent that this information, however incomplete, may be useful to organisations and to individuals outside of Landcare Research. We have decided to make this information publicly available to highlight the diversity of the activities in progress and to encourage individuals and organisations working in similar areas to connect with each other and continue to be aware of the different activities and communications in progress. In making this document public, we do ask that users keep in mind the caveats below, which are born of the document's original purpose as a rapid, internal, scoping exercise.

The document is not a comprehensive list of all activities underway; it is a sample, and the author acknowledges that some details, even within this sample, are missing. The document should be considered illustrative, and a useful starting point for identifying possible connections, but should not be relied upon to be accurate in all cases.

Information included here is largely taken from publicly available sources and, in most cases, has not been verified beyond these sources. Most information comes from the sources listed but in some cases sources such as Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, and the websites of organisations mentioned in the document have been searched to provide further details on people and activities. In the interests of keeping the references here manageable these sources are not always listed exhaustively; these details are, however, available on request.

Landcare Research does not intend to keep this document up to date in future; however, we would welcome approaches from others who may wish to do so. In particular, we see great potential for this document to be developed into a publicly updatable wiki; if you are able to do this we'd love to hear from you.
