Three agents have been released to attack alligator weed: alligator weed moth and two similar-looking alligator weed beetles. The alligator weed moth (Arcola malloi) and one of the alligator weed beetles (Agasicles hygrophila) have established well and cause significant damage to the weed on lakes and ponds. The other alligator weed beetle (Disonycha argentinenis), which was more suited to terrestrial habitats, failed to establish. Additional agents may be released in future to add further pressure to the weed, especially for terrestrial infestations.
